Proclamation of 1763

- Bans settlement west of Appalachians
 - Little possibility of enforcement
 - Tensions continue

Calm before the storm

- Parliament repealed most Townshend Acts
 - King George III asked to keep tax on tea

Tea to coffee

- British East India Company
 - Asia to colonies
 - Merchants to consumers

Tax Act

- Allowed the bypass of merchants
 - sell direct to colonists
 - still opposed
 - could ruin other businesses
 - Daughters/Sons of Liberty

Boston Tea Party

- Nov 1773
- Disguised as Natives and dumped the tea



Britain Retaliates

- mixed reaction in colonies
 - Intolerable Acts
 - shut down the port of Boston
 - town meeting/once per year/ governor approval
 - customs officials trials in Britain
 - new Quartering Act

Unification

- Response was fast throughout the other colonies
- 1774 delegates met in the First Continental Congress
 - Boycott
 - No more exports
 - set up militias



- General Thomas Gage would march to capture arms stored by minutemen
 - Lexington-minutemen are about to leave when a shot rings
 - Fighting continued in the nearby town of Concord
